PrimeSite Web originally modeled a first-phase web application for a new venture partnership between Leadership Fort Worth, the United Way, and other notable non-profits. Known as “BoardBuild”, the web system featured a custom Learning Module System (LMS) with videos, testing system for included video content, and a Non-Profit/Individual Matching system that would qualify anyone passing the curriculum to act as a successful member of a board.

American Airlines Credit Union was interested in the performance of its Credit Union branches, therefore a system was created to take surveys that were, in turn, used to measure the performance of executives for bonus awards. The program was discontinued after a year when the executives preferred not to have such detailed information. Developed in conjunction with Kearley and Company, Fort Worth, TX.

Student athletes showcase for sports performances, allowing typically underfunded college recruiters to get a feel for any athletes’ capabilities. This would have been the first sports-based social media platform. Sadly, the owners were not able to secure venture capital enough to move the project into a successful business entity.

## BUSINESSLINC FW

2002 - 2004

PrimeSite Web partnered with the City of Fort Worth Business Development Department to create a web system that measured the relationship performance between Mentors (large corporations) and Proteges (small businesses). Funding was issued as a grant by the U.S. Small Business Administration through the Clinton Administration and the program was wildly successful.
